



SEREN: context

- Security research: a new thematic priority within FP
 - Limited background (PASR: 3 years + 2 call for proposals in FP7)
 - New research and innovation stakeholders (many from defense background) not used to FP procedures
- Security specificities
 - Quite recent research field as such
 - Few integrated pan European industries (world market) but also many small highly specialized SMEs (national markets)
 - Necessity to involve End-users!
 - Necessity to closely work together with SHS communities
 - "Natural" sensitive issues (access to/exchange of information, ethical considerations...)
- Security research presents close links with other EU policies

SEREN: rationale + objectives

- Improve each level of service
 - Increase NCPs (and stakeholders) knowledge of Security research landscape and actuality: policy notes, exchange of best practices, mapping of national research programmes, preparation of competencies mapping...
 - Identify fields of improvements: stakeholders needs analysis, NCP needs analysis...
 - Creation of knowledge pool
- Foster a network approach to NCP services by pooling together resources and cooperating
 - Cooperate on partner search (brokerage events, database, process)
 - ⇒ Launch of the SEREN network for a limited 18 months duration
 - ⇒ SEREN phase 1 (February 2008 July 2009)

Objectives: identify network needs and initiate coordination

Objectives: increase NCP knowledge and awareness of the European security landscape

WP3

Objectives: training of NCPs in order to increase the added-value of each NCP and the network as a whole + improvement of the partner search






Description of topic:

- Based upon the phase 1 NCP project, SEREN, further reinforce the network of National Contact Points (NCP)
- The action will focus on identifying and sharing good practices. This may entail various
 mechanisms such as benchmarking, joint workshops, technical training on security specific
 issues, and twinning schemes. Practical initiatives to benefit cross-border audiences may
 also be included, such as trans-national brokerage events.
- The proposal should include an in-depth mapping of security research national systems and programmes, improved presentation of the mapping in order to leverage the impact of the dissemination of the results.
- As for the partner search tool, it should be coordinated with CORDIS, or any other tool
 upon which the Commission agrees.
- Special attention will be given to helping less experienced NCPs rapidly acquire the knowhow accumulated in other countries. However, the participation as partners to the project should be organised around a number of regional clusters of NCPs.
 - It is expected to fund co-ordination and support action (coordinating action), and a funding of up to an indicative EUR 1.5 million is envisaged. It is expected that the project should last for a maximum of 3 years, and should in any case finish before March 2013.
